



Shelburne County has a climate similar to many locations along the South Shore of Nova Scotia and coastal locations of northern New England. Due to its coastal location and moderating influence of the Atlantic Ocean, Shelburne County's climate is relatively temperate without major extremes in temperature.

Winters are wet and cold, with snow, freezing rain and rain frequent from mid December to the end of March. Snow is common in the winter months, however it rarely stays on the ground for extended periods of time. Spring is cool and frequently damp, while summer features some of the best weather in Canada from June to the end of September. Autumn weather features pleasant days and cool nights and this can extend well into November.

Shelburne Marine Terminal

Shelburne Marine Terminal provides wharf and cargo handling facilities for a number of vessels carrying diverse cargoes such as containers, bulk commodities and fish products. Shelburne's harbour has an ice-free, deep water advantage, ensuring year round access.

Shelburne Marine Industrial Park

Shelburne Marine Industrial Park is perfectly positioned and well equipped to accommodate new and expanding businesses. Located on the southern tip of Nova Scotia, Shelburne is close to international shipping routes and also within easy reach of the most important Eastern seaboard ports in the USA.

The Best Natural Harbour

Shelburne Harbour is known as one of the best natural harbours in the world; the channel is 800 metres wide with a minimum depth of 9 metres through its narrows. The Harbour has safe anchorages for vessels in 13 metres of water.

New Collaborative Health Centre

The new Shelburne Collaborative Health Centre has been specially designed for a number of different health care providers working together with patients to provide coordinated care for individual health needs. Collaborative family practice teams have many benefits including continuing care, as the patient will build a trusting relationship with a team of health care providers.

Roseway Hospital

Roseway Hospital is a community hospital serving about 15,000 Shelburne County residents with primary care services, inpatient, ambulatory and emergency care. Nineteen inpatient beds include acute medical care, convalescent, cardiac care, pediatrics and care for people awaiting long-term care placement.

Some of Nova Scotia's most beautiful, dramatic, and natural coastline is found within Shelburne County. From the sheltered waters of Louis Head in the Sable River estuary to the open, white sand beaches of Cape Sable Island, an array of dynamic coastal ecosystems provide habitat for plants, birds and other wildlife. Several of our beaches are included in the international network of Important Bird Areas and are particularly special as they provide critical nesting habitat for endangered Piping Plovers or are important stopover sites for migrating shorebirds during late summer and fall.

Public Education


Elementary - There are five grade Primary to Six schools located throughout the communities of Shelburne County.

Nova Scotia Community College - Shelburne Campus is a small campus, but there is nothing small about the experiences. The extraordinary support of the surrounding community is integral to the campus. Everything about this South Shore campus will make you feel at home. The campus offers full time programs in Adult High School Diploma, Continuing Care, Oceans Technology - Fisheries and Oceans, and Electrical and Pipe Trades. In addition to the full time programs, the campus offers continuing education courses in areas such as First Aid, Safety and Technology. Custom training is available to support industry. The campus is home to the School of Fisheries which provides the full suite of safety and required courses to support the fishery. Other services available include a library (open to the public) with access to Novanet, wireless access, meeting rooms, computer labs and video conference capability.

Shelburne County Learning Network is an adult upgrading program that presents opportunities for improving literacy and numeracy skills, increasing self-confidence, acquiring new skills and personal growth.
